#### Pānui - WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW...

#### Portland School Te Kura o Tikorangi Out of Zone Enrolments 2025

The Portland School Te Kura o Tikorangi Board of Trustees has determined that there will be four enrolment periods for out of zone students in 2025 coinciding with each school term.

The deadlines for receiving out of zone applications for each school term will be:

- October 29, 2024 for Term 1, 2025
- March 14, 2025 for Term 2
- June 6, 2025 for Term 3
- August 22, 2025 for Term 4
- October 8 2025 for Term 1, 2026

Prior to these deadlines the Board of Trustees will determine and publish the number of places (if any) that are available at various class levels for out of zone students.

Current out of zone places available:


#### There are currently 5 out of zone places available at Portland School Te Kura o Tikorangi for Term 4

Applications for enrolments will be processed in the following order of priority:

- 1. This priority is not applicable at this school, because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary for Education
- 2. Siblings of current students
- 3. Siblings of former students
- 4. Children of former students
- 5. Children of Board employees
- 6. All other applicants

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group must be by ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newsletter circulating in the area served by the school. Applicants seeking second or third priority status will be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.

# Tūtuki mai tā mātou kaimahi - Meet our Kaimahi Whaea Emma our amazing Kaiāwhina!



### School Board Elections – Have Your Say! Ngā Kōwhiringa Poari Kura – Whakahua tō Reo!

The boards of all state and state-integrated schools are required to hold elections every three years, and this will be happening again in 2025.

The School Board is an important part of our kura as they set the strategic direction for our school, consult with our school community about our kura, ensure the school's funding is spent wisely and ensure that we are giving effect to Te Tiriti o Waitangi within our kura. Our board is made up of five parent vacancies, the Tumuaki, and a staff rep elected by the staff.

The current board have made the decision to appoint My School Election as the Returning Officer for our election and for the election to be provided online.

Surely, 1 day a week doesn't matter... It's only 10 minutes. 10 minutes is nothing. Actually, this is what is may look like:

If your child misses	That equals	Which is	After 13 years of schooling
10 minutes a day	50 mins a week	1½ days a week	½ a year
30 minutes a day	½ a day a week	4 weeks a year	1½ years
1 hour a day	1 day a week	8 weeks a year	2½ years
1 day a fortnight	20 days a year	4 weeks	1½ years
1 day a week	40 days a year	8 weeks	Over 2 ½ years
2 days a week	80 days a year	16 weeks	Over 5 years
3 days a week	120 days a year	24 weeks	Nearly 8 years





#### SORE THROATS MATTER

Te mamae o te korokoro hei aukati rumatiki

Preventing Rheumatic Fever Hei aukati i te kirikaa rumatiki

With winter on its way we need to be aware of tamariki getting sore throats.

For our Māori and Pacific tamariki sore throats can have long term health effects.

If your tamariki has a sore throat please get a throat swab from your Practice Nurse at your GP practice

Or

At a participating Pharmacy if your tamariki are:

Māori or Pacific aged 4-19

OR

Have a family history of Rheumatic Fever

All children are at risk of developing strep throat however, research has shown that the risk for this leading to Acute Rheumatic fever is predominantly higher in **Māori and Pacific** tamariki, this is the reason for the eligibility criteria in the throat swabbing programme.

# Health New Zealand Te Whatu Ora

A guide to managing communicable diseases for schools, early childhood education and care centres, kura, Kõhanga Reo, and language nests.

This guide is intended for schools, early childhood education and care centres (ECEs), kura kaupapa Māori, Kōhanga Reo and language nests. It provides information on serious infectious diseases you may come into contact with and what actions may be required to stop them spreading.

It covers influenza, gastroenteritis ilinesses (including norovirus), measles, meningococcal disease, mumps and pertussis (whooping cough).

For each of these information is provided on:

- Common symptoms and how the illness spreads
- How to protect your community and prevent illness
- What to do if someone has the disease or illness (or if you suspect they have it)
- Where to find more information

Specific guidance on COVID-19 is available separately from info health nz/conditionstreatments/infectious-diseases/covid-19/if-youhave-covid-19/

#### Infectious (communicable) diseases

are ones which can be spread from one person to another, most commonly through coughing, sneezing, or through contamination of food, drinks, surfaces and objects (including drinking bottles and vapes) by someone who has the disease.

#### Notifiable diseases

are diseases or illnesses which must be notified to a Medical Officer of Health (a Public Health Doctor) by other health practitioners and laboratories.

If someone has a notifiable disease and there was a risk of them passing it on to others at your education setting, then public health may contact you so together you can prevent any further spread of the disease.

### Knowing if a child is well enough to be at school

Health New Zealand - Te Whatu ora has released guidance for parents and school leaders on when it is okay for a child to still be at school and when an unwell child should be at home.

#### Your role as kaitātaki far your community

As an education provider you play a key role in keeping your community safe. This may include promoting preventative measures and supporting the management of infectious disease outbreaks which may occur on your premises or among tamariki, students and staff (kaimahi).

Key things you need to know.

- School principals (of State Schools) can preclude a student from attending if they believe on reasonable grounds they may have a communicable disease (using Section 77 of the Education and Training Act 2020)
- Medical Officers of Health have certain powers to manage notifiable diseases on a case-by-case basis

If someone who you believe has a communicable disease does not stay away from your service or school as requested, you can contact the local medical officer of health for advice and support.
